UNESCO Nomination Grand Pré Creative Art Challenge

In an effort to increase the level of engagement and awareness of Nomination Grand Pré, the project has developed a Creative Art Challenge for youth ages 10-18 and has sought out local and Acadian schools between Greenwood and Halifax to participate. Students who participate are asked to create a piece of artwork, whether a painting or a drawing, that represents to them what is special about Grand Pré. The artwork will be collected on February 1, 2010 and will be judged for the best overall art from each school. The winning artwork will be used in the creation of a collective mural encompassing all of the winning pieces. The final product will be sent to Paris in February 2011, along with the Nomination Dossier for the World Heritage Convention to review.
