### **Kings Community Economic Developments**

#### **Volunteers Sought**

The UNESCO World Heritage List is a list of natural and cultural properties that the World Heritage Committee has judged of being of outstanding universal value to be protected for future generations to appreciate and enjoy. In order for a site to be nominated as a potential World Heritage Site, it must first be on a State Party's Tentative List. A Canadian Tentative List was prepared in 2004. The cultural landscape of Grand-Pré was one of 11 national properties out of 125 considered to be included on Canada's tentative list!

Stakeholders are preparing a dossier to submit to UNESCO to have the Grand Pré Cultural Landscape recognized as a World Heritage Designation. Kings Community Economic Development Agency (Kings CED) and Société promotion Grand-Pré (SPGP) co-chair the Nomination Grand-Pré Advisory Board. The Board includes local groups as well as government partners.

A Management Working Group is being developed and volunteers are being sought to participate in this process. The goal of this working group is to discuss the management of the proposed property and to develop a management system that will ensure the long-term protection of the proposed outstanding universal value and maintain the proposed property's integrity and authenticity.

The first full day session for this group is scheduled for May 22, 2009.
